At camp this year we will be studying the Book of Revelation. Emanuel Swedenborg wrote two books about Revelation called Apocalypse Explained and Apocalypse Revealed. The Apocalypse has taken on an ominous interpretation in our world today. In the original Greek it means unveiling or revelation. This last book in the Bible is not about end times or the final destruction of the world as common dictionaries now define apocalypse. Swedenborg offers a deep dive into the inner spiritual mean-

ing of the stories and symbolism of the apocalyptic language found in the Book of Revelation as it relates to our own lives today.

The lecturers and teachers will offer useful interpretations of the many visions and sometimes overwhelming figurative stories in The Book of Revelation from the Bible Study Dole Notes. This will be fun as together we approach these teachings with a bit of whimsy and wonder at the visions of horsemen, dragons, and multi-headed beasts.

The glory at the end of this final Book of the Bible culminates with the descending of the Holy City New Jerusalem, and a new heaven and a new earth, with the River of Life running through it, promising that good will overcome evil and all shall be well. Rev. Jane

- Arrive and Sign In Please

For Summer School, plan on arriving Saturday afternoon, July 20. Dorm parents will be welcoming campers to their dorms between 4 and 5:30 p.m. (Dorms will not be open Friday night.)

We can no longer provide transportation to and from the airport.



Check-In Procedure

- Visit the Registrar, Heidi Barnaby, under the big tent between 4 and 5:30 p.m. to receive your housing assignment, information guide and daily schedule. Any campers arriving after 5:30 p.m. must find the Registrar upon arrival.
- Campers ages 5-17 are to meet with the Health Services Manager (Camp Nurse) upon check-in and must turn over all non-emergent prescriptions and over-the-counter medications in their original packaging for the Heath Service Manager to store and dispense in the Clinic.
- Any teens with cars, not attending camp with their parents, must turn their keys in at check-in.

Completed registration and medical forms should be sent in before arrival. Send all payments prior to July 6th. It helps to pay for the food we need to start camp. Please add a \$25 late fee to payments after July 6th.



Check-Out Procedure

Inform the Registrar of your departure (Sorry, we cannot refund for early departures). Children and teens should have their dorm parent check their living space. Please Note: State regulations stipulate that **we must know who is picking up sponsored children.** We will not release minors to anyone other than the person listed on the Sponsor Information Form.



Pre-Camp (Will Work for Food... and Fun!) Wednesday, July 17 -Friday, July 19



- 1. Pre-Camp will open at 2pm on Wednesday July 17th
- 2. Anyone under the age of 18 MUST be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Our dorms will not be open and we must still follow state licensing rules.
- 3. There will be optional evening outings to enjoy in the area.
- 4. There is going to be time for us to gather together in fellowship as well as a service projects. No skills needed! It is really just a way for us to hang out as a family.
- 5. There is no charge for these days however a love donation to offset expenses would be appreciated.



- Adults are to keep and consume any adult beverages in their private sleeping quarters. We are asking all adults to help in making all members of our camp feel welcomed and comfortable by keeping our public lounges safe and inviting for all campers.
- We are asking all campers to bring their own sleeping bag or sheets.
 The amount of laundry at the end of camp has been overwhelming.

Camp Activities

- Morning and evening chapel services
- Morning lecture and discussion groups for adults and teens
- Classes for pre-school through high school
- Supervised recreation, crafts, and swimming
- All-camp activities each evening: hikes, campfires, skits, music, carnival, games, etc.

Special Events

- * Teen emphasis: "Survivors" teen organization welcomes new teens at a candlelight worship service on Friday night, and sponsors fellowship activities, a snack store, and other service projects to raise money for the camp.
- * All-Camp Kickball Game: Held Saturday afternoon, July 27. Will this be the year when the long-standing tie between the Red and White teams is broken??!
- Annual Meeting of the Almont New Church Assembly: Saturday, July 27, at 2:15. Assembly membership is open to any adult who supports the teachings of the Swedenborgian Church and the ministry of the Almont New Church Assembly. Initial membership fee is \$5, with annual dues of \$5.
- * Almont Ladies Auxiliary: The annual meeting takes place in Big House's Hamilton Parlor, with business and fun on the agenda.





Teen Activities

Almont Summer School offers many fun opportunities for our teens each year. Swimming, kickball, volleyball, or just relaxing in Teen Storage are just a few of the activities the teens participate in. The group runs the camp store (a popular hangout!) offering pop, candy and other treats. The profits from store are used in many different camp improvement projects (for example, our historical marker, swing set, sports equipment, and more!) The name of the teen group is "The Survivors." Every teen is welcomed into this group through a special initiation and a beautiful Survivor Service on Friday night. Teens are reminded to bring dress clothes for this candle light service. Many teens have made life long friendships through their involvement with The Survivors.

Adult Activities – Looking for things to do in the afternoon and evenings? Look in the dining hall for a game of bridge, by the chapel for band practice, or in Big House Parlor for a competitive game of scrabble. Or if there is any other activity you would like to do just ask around and I'm sure there will be others who would love to join you.

New this year: Adult Spiritual Experiential Groups will gather in the afternoons to create, explore nature, and share.

DORMITORY COMPLEX – one level building with boys' and girls' wings.



Packing for Camp?? Here's what to bring...

- Warm evening clothes, cool daytime clothes
- Pillow & bed linens or sleeping bag—camp cannot provide this
- Bath towels & wash cloths, soap & shampoo, other toiletries

- Dress up clothes for Survivor Service and Sunday church
- Bible
- Flashlight, fishing gear, tennis racquet, softball mitt
- Musical instruments
- Spending money for the Survivor store, Candy Lady and A-Mart (\$20 is plenty)

Almont is not responsible for lost or stolen items – leave expensive electronics at home!



Almont's Rules For a Happy Camp Include...

- I. Everyone is expected to take part in all activities.
- II. Medications for all campers aged 5-17 must be turned in to the Health Services Manager in their original container. Adults must securely store any medications they bring in their living spaces. Over-the-counter medications will be stocked in the camp clinic and will be distributed by the Health Services Manger as required.
- III. Waterfront regulations apply to everyone and will be explained during the opening of camp.
- IV. **No alcoholic beverages are allowed in common areas**. Anyone under 21 years of age with alcohol will be sent home.
- V. No guns or weapons of any kind (real or toy).
- VI. Pets are not permitted without advanced approval by the Director.
- VII.If you are a non-registered visitor to Almont Summer School, you must leave by 11 p.m. No overnight stays are allowed for non-registered visitors. Visitors are also expected to participate in all camp activities and programs.
- VIII.No one under 18 is allowed to smoke on the premises
- IX. All buildings are smoke-free. Smoking is only permitted in designated outdoor locations.
- X. No marijuana or illegal drugs of any kind are allowed. If you are in possession of these substances you will be asked to leave camp



The sponsor program allows a limited number of youths to attend camp without parents. The adult sponsor attends camp and agrees to perform certain duties in place of the parent. Parents must arrange for a sponsor prior to camp.

These guidelines are strictly followed:

- 1. Children ages 5-17 who are at camp without a parent must have an adult sponsor who has signed the form below.
- 2. Sponsors agree to the following duties:
 - a. Ensure that the child takes part in all camp activities.
 - b. Care for the child in case of illness including emergency room trips or taking the child home.
 - c. Be present at bedtime (for children in the Little Dorm) to assist dorm parents.
 - d. See that the child takes daily showers and has laundry done as needed.
 - e. If sponsoring a small child, sit with the child at meals and help them at the buffet line.
 - f. Hold on to any expensive electronics
 - g. Consult the Director in case of disciplinary action.
 - h. No one should sponsor more than 3 children.


