

Almont's Rules for a Happy Camp Include...

1. All campers will choose LOVE, CARE, and RESPECT in all their interactions.
2. Everyone is encouraged to take part in all camp activities.
3. Waterfront regulations apply to everyone.
4. Alcoholic beverages must be stored and consumed responsibly. Anyone under 21 years of age found with alcohol will be sent home.
5. No guns or weapons of any kind (real or toy).
6. Pets are not permitted without advanced approval by the Director.
7. If you are a daily visitor to Almont Summer School, you must leave by 11pm. Daily visitors are encouraged to participate in all camp activities and programs, and must pay for any meals provided.
8. No one under 21 may smoke or vape while at Almont Summer School.
9. All buildings are smoke-free. Smoking or vaping is only permitted in designated outdoor locations.
10. No marijuana or illegal drugs of any kind are allowed. If you are found to be in possession of these substances you will be sent home.

Community Expectations...

- We place all returnable bottles and cans in the boxes provided.
- We pay for anything that we intentionally break.
- We stay out of the maintenance building and use camp tools only with the permission of the Facility Manager.

Where to Find it...

Be sure to meet with our registrar under the Big Tent to obtain your room assignment and further check-in/out instructions. Here is a quick tour of campus:

Adults stay in three buildings: Big House, Little Rec, and Heritage Hall (upstairs). Campers between the ages of 5 & 17 stay in two dorms, which are divided into three living areas each (Little, Middle, and Teen).

Meals are served in the Dining Hall in Heritage. Meal times are posted on schedules around the camp and in this book. Caregivers with little ones (ages 0-5) and those with mobility issues may enter the Dining Hall at the warning bell. Snacks are available at other times, but please do not eat any of the camp's food that has not been set out by the cooks.


Every morning we gather at the flagpole and proceed to the Chapel for morning worship. Following children's recreation and adult lecture time, we have our daily class.

In the afternoons we offer swimming, arts & crafts, and recreation for our younger campers. Children gather at the gate to Brandau Bay for swim time, at the Craft Cottage for the arts and crafts, and at the Rec Hall for recreation. Adults often sit on one of the many porches to relax and socialize. All adults are welcome on any porch and in any adult lounge. If you have any medical needs, see our Health Services Officer at the Clinic.
